Population

- Total Population: Approximately 126 million people.
- Population Density: Japan has one of the highest population densities in the

world, with about 347 people per square kilometer.

Urbanization

- Urban Population: About 92% of Japan's population lives in urban areas.
- Major Cities: Tokyo (the capital and largest city), Yokohama, Osaka, Nagoya,

Sapporo, Kobe, Fukuoka.

Biodiversity

• Flora and Fauna: Japan is home to diverse ecosystems, ranging from subtropical

in the south to temperate in the north. Key species include the Japanese

macaque, sika deer, and red-crowned crane.

• Protected Areas: Over 30 national parks and numerous other protected areas

preserve Japan's rich biodiversity.

- Major Ethnic Group: Approximately 98.5% of the population is ethnically Japanese.
- Minority Groups: Includes Ainu, Ryukyuan, Korean, Chinese, and other small





- Official Language: Japanese.
- Minority Languages: Ainu language (spoken by the Ainu people), Ryukyuan
 - languages (spoken in Okinawa and other Ryukyu Islands), Korean, and Chinese are
 - also spoken among minority communities.



• Vending Machines Everywhere: Japan has over 5 million vending machines, selling everything from drinks and snacks to umbrellas and

fresh eggs.

- World's Oldest Company: The oldest company in the world, Kongō Gumi, was founded in Japan in 578 AD. It specialized in temple building.
- Unique Cuisine: Japan is famous for its sushi, sashimi, ramen, and tempura. It's also the birthplace of instant noodles, invented by Momofuku Ando in 1958.
- High Life Expectancy: Japan has one of the highest life expectancies in the world, with many people living well into their 80s and 90s.
- Cherry Blossom Festivals: Every spring, Japan celebrates the blooming of cherry blossoms (sakura) with festivals and picnics under the blooming

trees, a tradition known as hanami.

- Sumo Wrestling: Sumo is Japan's national sport and has a history spanning over 1,500 years. It combines athleticism with Shinto ritual and tradition.
- Anime and Manga: Japan is the global hub for anime and manga, with countless series and characters that have gained international fame.
- Technology Hub: Japan is a leader in technology and innovation, home to companies like Sony, Nintendo, Panasonic, and Toyota. Tokyo is known for

its cutting-edge electronics and robotics.

• Bullet Trains: Japan's Shinkansen, or bullet trains, are famous for their

speed and punctuality, reaching speeds of up to 320 km/h (199 mph).

• Mount Fuji: The iconic Mount Fuji is Japan's highest peak at 3,776 meters

(12,389 feet). It's a popular destination for both climbers and tourists and


is considered a sacred mountain in Japanese culture.
